



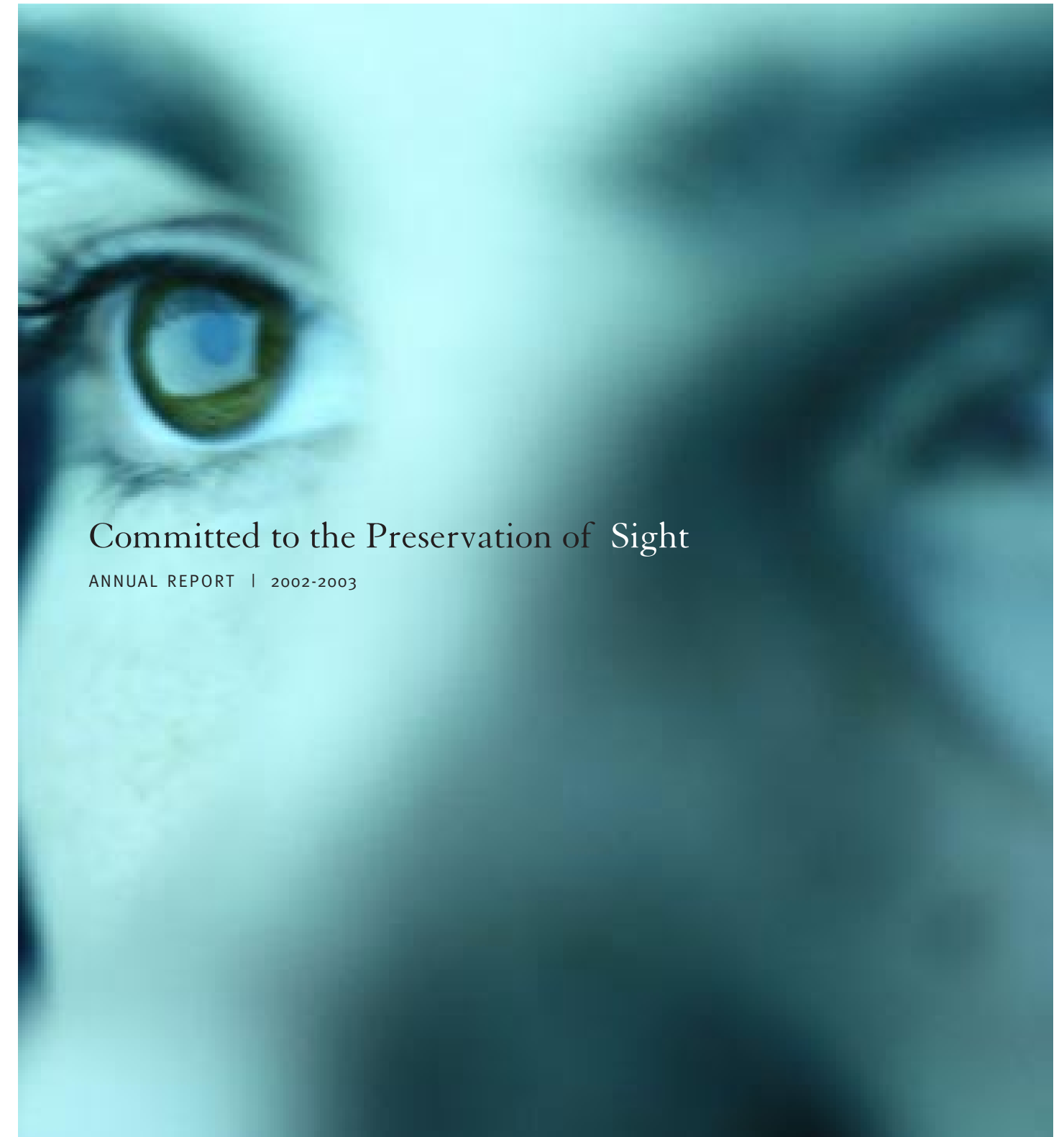

Founded in 1980, EyeCare America, the public service foundation of the American Academy of Ophthalmology, is a leader in the worldwide preservation of sight, achieving its mission through public service and education. In the United States, EyeCare America is one of the largest providers of eye care services to the medically underserved and educates the general public about the eye and vision. Internationally, our programs help educate ophthalmologists in developing nations in order to ensure that quality eye care services are available to those nations most in need. EyeCare America is a non-profit organization whose success is made possible by its corps of more than 7,500 volunteer ophthalmologists who donate their services and through the funding contributed by corporations, foundations, and individuals.

PUBLIC SERVICE

Public Service provides access to eye care for the medically underserved and for those at increased risk for eye disease through its corps of 7,500 volunteer ophthalmologists who donate their services. More than 90 percent of the care made available through EyeCare America is provided at no out-of-pocket cost to the patients. Public service includes programs for seniors, glaucoma, diabetes, and children, and is the largest program of its kind in the United States. Since 1985, EyeCare America’s public service program has handled more than 644,000 calls, provided services to 347,000 people, and treated more than 180,000 cases of eye disease.

Last year, EyeCare America reached over 260 million people with eye care messages and provided services to 18,588 people.

SENIORS EYECARE PROGRAM • Provides educational materials on eye health and connects seniors with ophthalmic care at no out-of-pocket cost.

GLAUCOMA EYECARE PROGRAM • Encourages early detection and treatment of glaucoma by promoting awareness of glaucoma risk factors and providing glaucoma eye exams to qualified individuals who are at increased risk.

DIABETES EYECARE PROGRAM • Provides educational materials that increase awareness of the importance of yearly, dilated eye examinations for individuals with diabetes and provides eye care to individuals 65 and older at no out-of-pocket cost.

CHILDREN’S EYECARE PROGRAM • Educates parent and primary care physicians about the importance of early childhood eye screenings and treatment.

INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE

International Assistance helps improve eye care in developing nations by enhancing the education and training of ophthalmologists in those regions. To date, EyeCare America has provided over 700 training institutions with free ophthalmic educational materials and has hosted hundreds of ophthalmologists from developing countries at the American Academy of Ophthalmology’s annual meeting, where they benefit from instruction and skills transfer courses.

Last year, EyeCare America provided 266 ophthalmology training programs with free ophthalmic educational materials, hosted 32 guest ophthalmologists during the Academy’s annual meeting, and linked 340 ophthalmologists to volunteer opportunities in developing countries.

EDUCATION DISTRIBUTION • International Assistance provides much-needed educational materials to ophthalmology training programs and university and hospital libraries in developing nations with the least resources.

HOST PROGRAMS • The Rotary Club Host Project sponsors ophthalmologists from developing nations to come to the United States for a two-week professional, educational, social and cultural immersion, beginning with the first week in the hosting Rotary Club’s community and concluding with the second week at the Academy’s Annual Meeting.

VOLUNTEER REGISTRY • Designed to connect ophthalmic professionals interested in volunteering their skills in a developing nation with organizations and institutions that need assistance, the International Volunteer Registry provided more than 300 individuals with information on volunteer sites and assisted 128 organizations and institutions in locating volunteers.

MUSEUM OF VISION

The Museum of Vision educates people of all ages about the eye, vision and the history of eye care through traveling exhibits, loans to educational institutions, and the distribution of related materials to the general public. Since its establishment in 1980 as a public education program of EyeCare America, the museum has reached more than 30 million people in the U.S.

Last year, EyeCare America’s museum reached over 148,000 children and their families through its activities and officially launched its educational web site: www.museumofvision.org.

COLLECTION • Each year the museum acquires many items for its collection, including artifacts, archival materials and rare books. A personal history often accompanies each donation to the museum, making for not only an interesting collection, but one with a rich and varied background.

EXHIBITS • Nearly 83,000 people toured the award-winning Animal Eyes™ exhibit in one of three, two-month runs in venues across the country. The 2,000-square-foot exhibit is in its second three-year tour, thanks to a grant from Alcon Laboratories, Inc. for refurbishment and to the Association of Science-Technology Centers, who manages the tour.

EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES • The museum introduced nearly 60,000 people to the world of vision through its educational resources available to physicians, teachers, parents, and other museums interested in teaching people of all ages about the eye, vision, and the history of eye care.

HISTORY RESOURCE SERVICES • The museum’s history resource services assist with a wide range of historical research requests. Each year Academy members, non-ophthalmologist physicians, teachers, parents, children, and members of the general public take advantage of the Museum of Vision’s educational resources by directing specific inquiries to staff, conducting on-site historical research, and accessing photos.

OPHTHALMIC EDUCATION

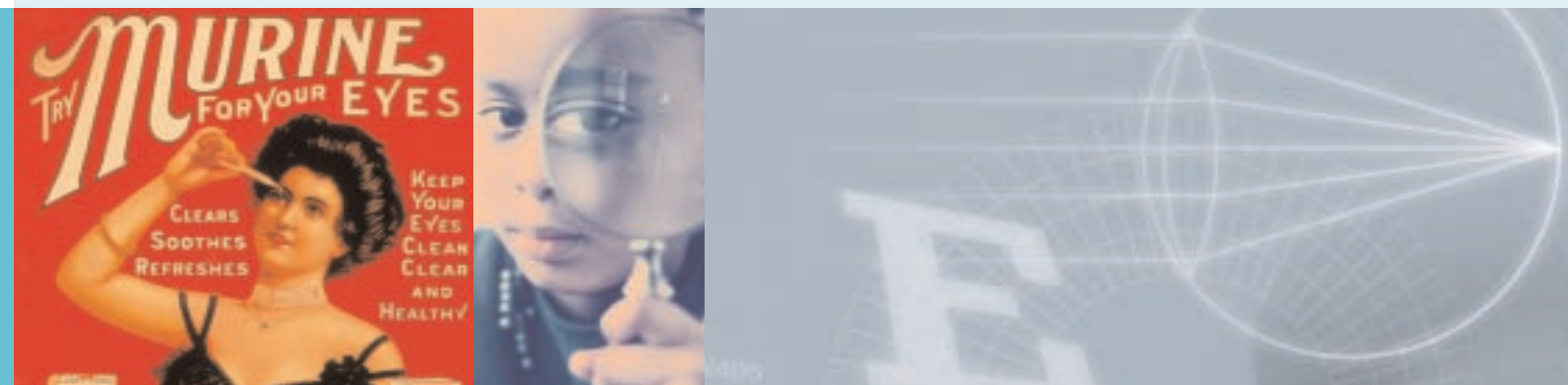
Ophthalmic Education supports the development of current and clinically relevant educational materials such as specialty clinical updates, Basic Clinical Science Courses (BCSC’s) and an easy-to-use, ophthalmic knowledge base created by the American Academy of Ophthalmology. Through this support, eye care doctors and professionals worldwide can obtain the educational resources necessary to improve eye care. Since 1980, EyeCare America has raised over \$4 million in support of this need.
