

Kritzinger Memorial Award



Dr. J. Bradley Randleman

The Kritzinger Memorial Award recognizes an individual who embodies the clinical, educational and investigative qualities of Dr. Kritzinger, who advanced the international practice of refractive surgery.

J. Bradley Randleman, MD is an associate professor in the Department of Ophthalmology at Emory University. Dr. Randleman's areas of expertise include corneal and intraocular refractive surgical procedures, the management of corneal and external eye diseases, corneal transplantation and cataract surgery.

Dr. Randleman received his BA degree from Columbia University in New York City. He earned his MD degree from Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas, where he was elected to the Alpha Omega Alpha Medical Honor Society. He then completed his residency training at Emory University, where he served as chief resident in his final year. Dr. Randleman joined the Emory faculty and served as assistant residency director for two years while also completing a fellowship in cornea/external disease and refractive surgery at Emory University. He was awarded the prestigious Claes Dohlman Society Award, which is given annually to only one individual in the United States for academic and surgical excellence in cornea and refractive surgery training. He now serves as director of the Emory Corneal Fellowship program.

Dr. Randleman has received the Secretariat Award from the American Academy of Ophthalmology for special contributions to the field of ophthalmology and was awarded the first Binkhorst Young Ophthalmologist Award from the American Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgery.

Dr. Randleman was recently appointed as the editor-in-chief for the *Journal of Refractive Surgery*. He has authored more than 60 publications in leading ophthalmology journals and more than 10 book chapters on LASIK evaluation and management of complications.
